Acceptable documents to establish a continuous statutory excuse	
1.	A passport (current or expired) showing the holder is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Gibraltar based in the UK at the end of the UK tax year.
2.	A passport or passport card (in either case, whether current or expired) showing that the holder is an Irish citizen.
3.	A document issued by the Railways of Ireland, the Railways of Guernsey or the Isle of Man which has been verified as valid by the Home Office Employer Checking Service, showing that the holder has been granted unconditionally to the Islands Immigration Rules Appendix E1 to the Immigration (Regulation of Government) Rules 2008 or Appendix E1.1 to the Isle of Man Immigration Rules.
4.	A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is a member of the British Royal Air Force, the British Army or the British Royal Navy on their stay in the UK.
5.	A remaining valid visa issued to the holder by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement to the effect that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely, has no time limit on their stay in the UK, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a government agency or a recognised employer.
6.	A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a government agency or a recognised employer.

2.	A document issued by the Bailiwick of Jersey, the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man, which has been verified as valid by the Home Office Employer Checking Service, showing that the holder has been granted limited leave to enter or remain under Appendix 5L(J) to the Jersey Immigration Rules or Appendix 5L to the Immigration Rules (Bailiwick of Guernsey) or Appendix 5L to the Immigration Rules (Bailiwick of Jersey).
3.	A permit to work issued by the Home Office containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with a valid endorsement that the holder is permitted to do the type of work in question, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a government agency or a previous employer.

<b>List B: Group 2</b>	
Documents where a time-limited statutory excuse lasts for 6 months	
1.	A document issued by the Home Office showing that the holder has made an application for leave to enter or remain under Appendix 5L to the Immigration Rules (Immigration and the Elder Settlement Scheme), on or before 30 June 2021 together with a Positive Verification Notice from the Home Office Employer Checking Service.
2.	A Certificate of Application (digital) issued by the Home Office (Immigration and the Elder Settlement Scheme) on or before 30 June 2021, together with a Positive Verification Notice from the Home Office Employer Checking Service.
3.	A document issued by the Bailiwick of Jersey or the Bailiwick of Guernsey, which has been verified as valid by the Home Office Employer Checking Service, showing that the holder has made an application for leave to enter or remain under Appendix EU(J) to the Jersey Immigration Rules or Appendix EU to the Immigration Rules (Bailiwick of Guernsey) or Appendix EU to the Immigration Rules (Bailiwick of Jersey).  Positive Verification Notice from the Home Office Employer Checking Service.
4.	An Application Registration Card issued by the Home Office stating that the holder is permitted to take the employment in question, together with a Positive Verification Notice from the Home Office Employer Checking Service.
